The Power Murals Hold in Healing: Creating in Community, by the Community, and for the Community

There's value and healing power that comes with all kinds of art - more specifically, there's power in public art, and art that comes from our very own communities. Previous research discusses the scientific ways in which art is useful in healing, looking at a more generalized view of art, like dance, drawing, writing, painting, etc. Beyond scientific research, much of the research that has been done is on the history and timeline of murals, looking at a specific moment in time, and the politics of this kind of art. 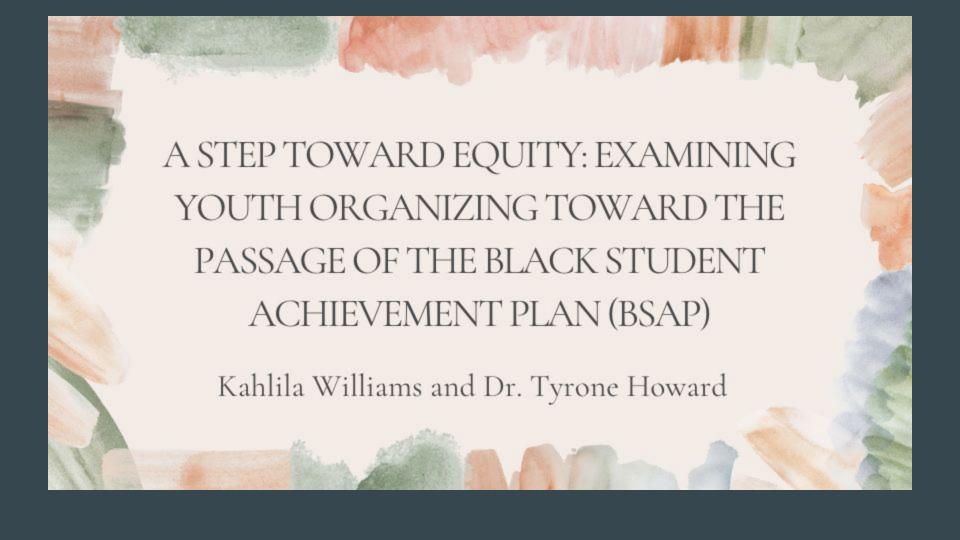
